Reading is the key to success

- Make reading *fun*
- Share a book *together*
- Encourage your child to practise sitting properly with legs crossed and on a chair
- Challenge them to *listen carefully* to the story's events
- Spend time each day *listening* to your child read
- *Talk* about the characters in the book
- Meeting about reading in the first half term
- Reading record book



Developing Independence

When at school

- Be very positive about your child starting school
- Be brave: say 'Good-bye' at the door
- Always tell your child who will be picking them up at the end of the school day
- Support your child with their reading
