For the remainder of the term we would like the children to be a little more creative. We would like them to use items they have at home to create a home fit for a Prehistoric man or woman.

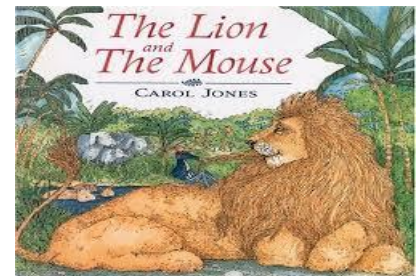
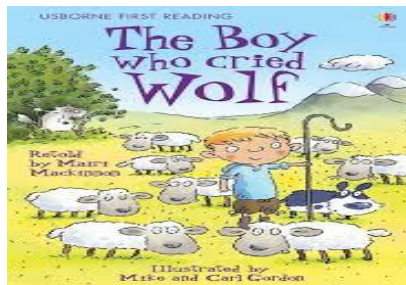
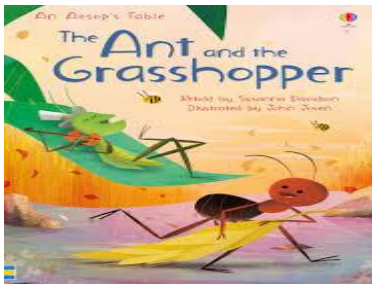
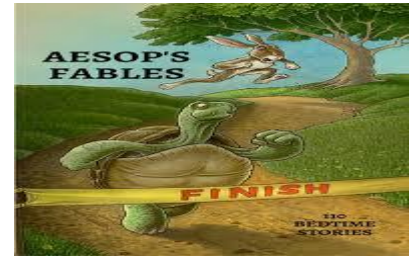
The house must come from one of the three Prehistoric Periods (Stone, Bronze & Iron) and have some of the features we they have learnt about in school.

English

Next week in English, we are going to be reading fables. Fables are stories that teach the reader a lesson and usually contain animals that act like humans.

Maths

This week in maths, the children have been introduced to word problems and they have begun solving these by using the column method.

Challenge
