### School Dinners

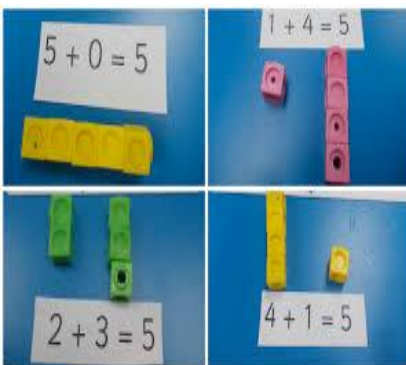
Please remember to select your child's school dinners via the online service. Thank you.
