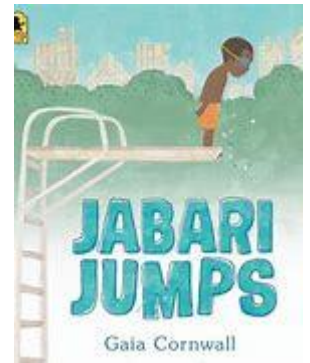
This Week's Learning
