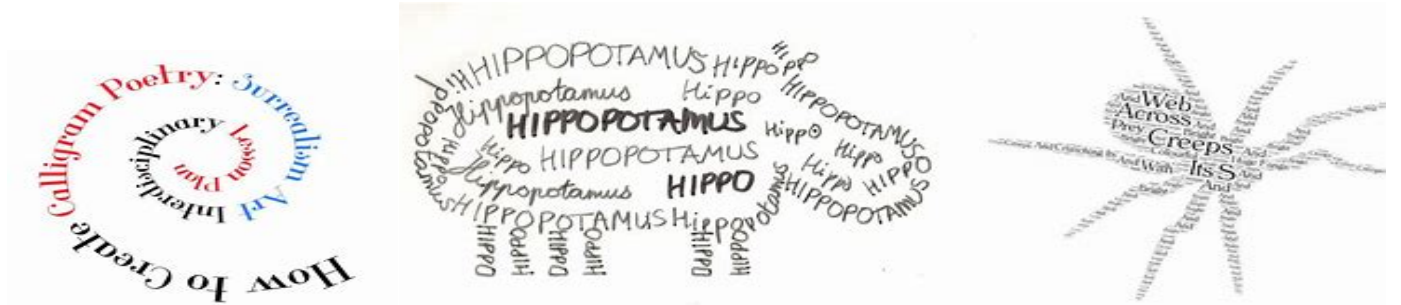
## Spring 2 - Half-Term Project
