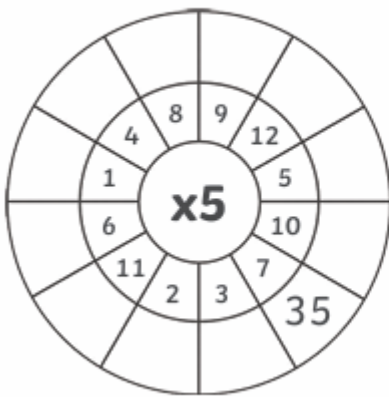

In English this week, we have begun reading the book 'The Lost Homework'.

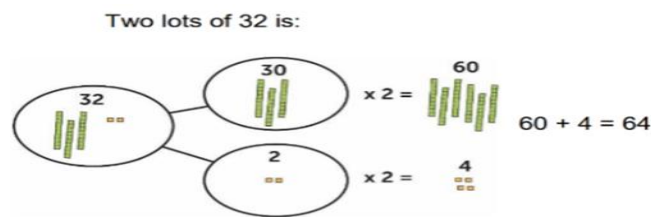
