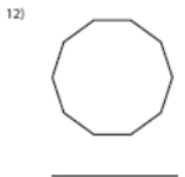
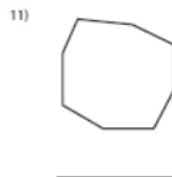
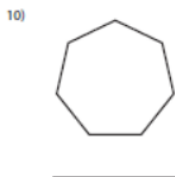
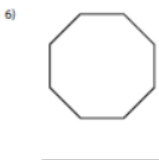
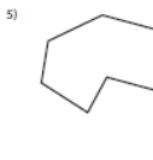
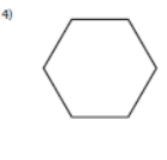
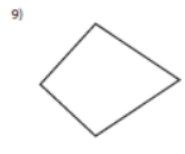
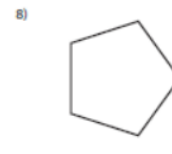
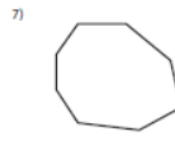
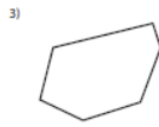
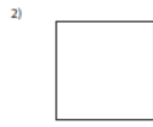
**Challenge:** Create another free verse poem about your favourite subject at school. Make sure within your poem you include some of the features taught.
