Summer 2 - Half-Term Project

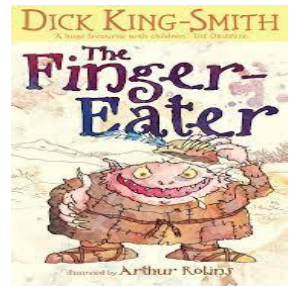
This Half Term we will be learning about being a scientist and investigating scientists such as Mary Anning and Samuel Morse.
