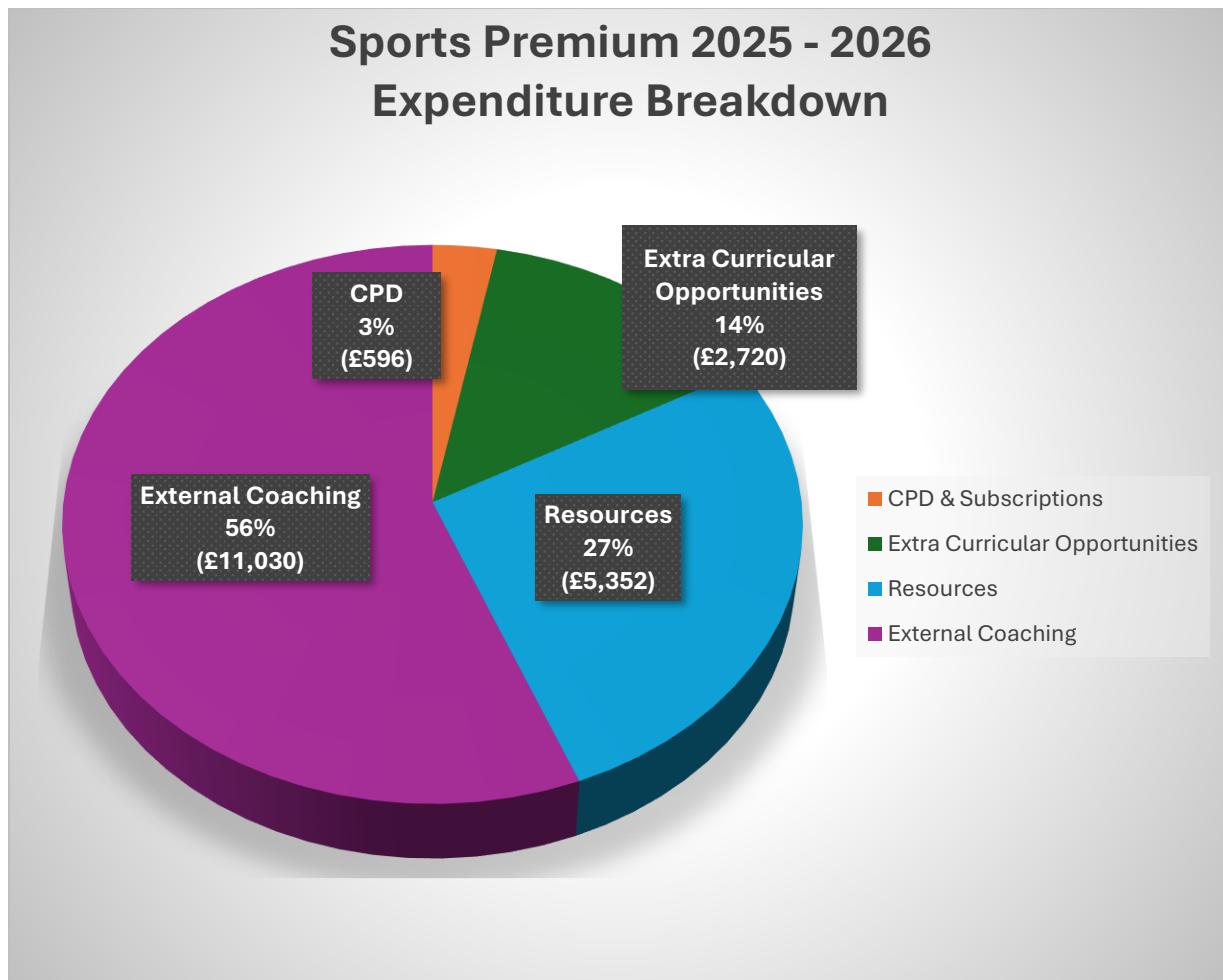

Opportunities in Sport

Has your school targeted any spending on providing or improving opportunities in sport and physical activities for disadvantaged pupils?

Yes, by providing after school sports clubs such as karate and street dance and lunchtime and pre-school football free of charge to all students, including disadvantaged pupils.

The sport premium funding has had a positive impact in the following areas:
